

During the month of March, the Animal Shelter became overcrowded with dogs due to the combination of a slowdown in adoptions during the previous six months and a recent surge in the number of large dogs entering the Shelter as strays.

To help "clear the kennels" and find homes for these deserving canines, Friends of the Animal Shelter held the first ever reduced-fee dog adoption event at the Shelter on Saturday and Sunday, April 2 and 3. Adoption fees for large dogs were reduced from \$150 to \$50, with Friends of the Animal Shelter paying \$100 per dog and providing lots of volunteers to help with making sure the dogs found perfect fur-ever homes.

Cars started arriving at 11:15 AM on Saturday, and by 4:00 PM, 9 dogs and 2 puppies had left with their new owners.

On Sunday, 6 more dogs found new homes, making it a total of 17 dogs adopted in just 2 days.

"We were so impressed with the number and quality of potential adopters who sincerely wanted to help the animals," said event organizer, Barbara Talbert. "The number of adoptions surpassed our expectations and gave us the room needed to move more dogs into adoption."

Unfortunately, the decrease in adoptions is a recent trend being experienced by other animal shelters across the country. The kennels are already filling up with new dogs looking for homes and the Shelter can still use your help.

Spay/Neuter Trailer UPDATE Speeding up services and adoptions





One of the Rogue Valley's biggest struggles these days is finding appointments to spay and neuter the community's pets. This has also been a challenge for the Shelter during the last few years, but it became much worse since the Almeda fire and COVID hit the valley.

The first surgery was performed on July 19, 2021. Since then, 98 felines and 24 canines have been spayed and neutered in the trailer, which conveniently lives in the parking lot next to the Animal Shelter.

Surgeries are scheduled four full days each month, based on the availability of Dr. Tim Groves, visiting veterinarian, and Deanne MacGaugh, licensed veterinary technician. They are assisted by a fabulous team of Friends of the Animal Shelter volunteers: Bob Crowley, Terri Frazier, Bunnie Harmon, and Elaine Ritchey, who each bring a unique set of skills to the surgical suite. This dedicated team works long hours during surgery days to ensure the animals are safe and are well cared for during and after their surgeries. In addition, Deeanne spends time the day prior to surgical days to make sure each scheduled animal is prepped and ready for the next morning. She is excited how well the surgeries have been going and praised the volunteers for their teamwork.

Our current goal is to be able to perform 12 surgeries each day, which means 48 animals are making their way into adoption quicker each month. Challenges to expanding beyond the current number of scheduled surgeries include maintaining a trained volunteer team, and needing another licensed veterinarian or vet tech. Because the suite can only accommodate animals under 50 pounds, additional veterinary resources to spay and neuter large dogs are still a big need for the Shelter.

Kim Casey, Program Manager of Jackson County Animal Services, states, "this recently implemented spay/neuter operation at the Shelter hasn't realized its full impact yet and will become invaluable as kitten season starts up this spring."

While the current schedule is helping many of the animals move more quickly through the Shelter and into new homes, Kim is also looking at different ways that the trailer can be used to expand spay/neuter in the community.

Volunteer HIGHLIGHT Jenni Brusca, Friend to Felines

We'd like to introduce you to Jennifer (Jenni) Brusca. Cat volunteer extraordinaire!

During the week, Jenni is a full-time nurse, but come Sunday afternoon, she can be found joyously volunteering in the cat rooms at the Jackson County Animal Shelter.

Jenni attended a Friends of the Animal Shelter volunteer orientation in September 2016, and was hooked. Interestingly, her first day "on the job" happened to take place during the annual Catstravaganza fee-waived adoption event, when potential adopters lined up outside the Shelter waiting to give deserving cats new homes. She very quickly learned about the cat adoption process and has taken on a variety of roles at the Shelter ever since.

Jenni chose to be trained as an Adoption Counselor, a fulfilling role because she "loves finding just the right home for the kitties." In addition to volunteering in the Shelter, Jenni helps care for ringworm foster kittens at Puck's Place, and fosters ringworm kittens at her home as well, which is both a challenge and a blessing.

Jenni writes the Sunday Mews, an email that is sent daily to inform cat room volunteers about adoptions and special needs of kitties waiting to be adopted. And, she is responsible for promoting kittens and cats for the FOTAS Facebook page, including writing kitten and cat descriptions, adoption stories, and special interest posts.

If that isn't enough, Jenni serves on the Program Advisory and Publicity committees, and teaches the Cat 101 and Adoption Counseling classes for new volunteers. Jenni explains, "I love each of these roles, because they allow me to use my unique stills as a creative writer, educator, nurse, and supporter of animal rights."

Jenni came to the Rogue Valley in 1991 to begin her nursing career. She built a house in Talent that she shares with six inside cats, three of which she fostered, and one community cat that lives outside. When she's not working or volunteering, Jenni enjoys being outdoors, kayaking on a mountain lake, hiking on local trails, and tending to her garden.

Jenni's heart extends to other charitable causes. "I sponsor three children around the world, two wolves at a sanctuary



in Washington State, two bats in Australia, a cat in Thailand, three dogs on the east coast, and a donkey at Equamore, a local horse sanctuary. I am also a world traveler and successfully summited Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, Africa."

Jenni is a gift to Friends of the Animal Shelter, giving her time and heart with a lovely smile and hearty laugh. She generously creates a better place for her feline friends and others. We are thrilled to thank her publicly for her service.

New Signage at the Shelter Improving the visitor and volunteer experience

As we all know, the Jackson County Animal Shelter has been around for quite a while ... and, well, the signage was looking a bit worn out.

Over the past year, members of the ad hoc Sign Committee, Vicki Chamberlain, Barbara Talbert and Eliza Kauder, set out to create an improved signage system at the Shelter. The goal was to provide clearer directions to the main entrance of the Shelter and to improve the visitor's experience. The end result is a more professional and cohesive look.

First and foremost, the sign on Hwy 99 was badly faded and barely readable after years of multiple changes. Completely replacing the sign was not an option per zoning regulations, so a facelift was designed and installed. New easily changeable banners have also been added to the bottom of the sign highlighting special events and messages.



Improved Way-finding

Finding your way into the Shelter is a bit challenging as well, as the Shelter sits behind a county maintenance building and is not visible from the road. The improved "way-finding" signage now helps direct the public to the office and kennels. And, offers messages to encourage visitors to adopt, foster, volunteer and donate.



Kitten season has begun!



It's time for our annual ORPHANED KITTENS SHOWER

You're invited to contribute to the Friends of the Animal Shelter annual Orphaned Kittens Shower to purchase supplies that support the needs of the HUNDREDS of vulnerable foster kittens and our nurturing Foster Program volunteers who will care for them. As you can imagine, supply chain challenges are showing up in higher prices!

MEDICAL CARE: Help cover the costs of medications and medical care. Lots of kittens come in with medical needs, like upper respiratory and eye infections. Most of these are easily treated, but we need to provide the medications.

PREVENTION: It's amazing how fast kitties can reproduce, starting at only 4 months of age! Your donation will support our spay/neuter-before-adoption efforts, most of which are now done in the Friends of the Animal Shelter Spay/Neuter Suite (see page 5). Help us "flatten the curve" of unplanned litters.

NURISHMENT AND SUPPLEMENTS: Boy, can these little furballs eat! We purchase kitten milk-replacement formula, high-calorie foods specifically for young kittens, and nipples and bottles. Oh, and what goes

in, must come out, so we go through a lot of special lightly-clumping litter and shallow litter boxes.

HOUSING AND COMFORT: Along with washable beds, SnuggleSafe warming pads (\$30 each), and playpens (\$60 each), we are raising funds to purchase one more incubator (\$1,200) to keep our most vulnerable days-old kittens warm and safe. The two incubators we purchased two years ago have been invaluable in foster homes! Now we need one at the Shelter for incoming super-young kittens while they wait to go into foster care.

Thank You, Betty White

On January 17, 2022, Friends of the Animal Shelter participated in a world-wide tribute to what would have been Betty White's 100th birthday called the #BettyWhiteChallenge.

We decided to raise funds for our dedicated Older Animals Medical Fund. Many animals enter the Shelter with non-lifethreatening medical needs, like dental work and minor corrective surgeries, that are not in the Shelter's budget.

By taking care of their immediate needs, these deserving older pets are more easily adopted into new, loving homes.

Because of YOUR generosity, 370 donors contributed close to \$16,000. And three generous people became monthly donors to this fund as well!

Happy Birthday, Betty! Thank you for leaving a legacy of saving deserving animals.





Facebook and NextDoor postings tell us how many animals go missing and are never returned to their owners. It's heartbreaking for both the family and the pets.

Hundreds of people are signing up and lining up to have their beloved pets injected with a small microchip that holds the owner's contact information. Friends of the Animal Shelter offers low-cost microchipping clinics to provide a permanent form of identification that can be scanned by any veterinarian or shelter if your pet wanders from home. They are tiny, about the size of a large grain of rice, and are passive. This means that they passively store a unique identification number and do not actively transmit any information. The microchip implanted in your pet has no battery and no internal power source, so it sits inertly in the dog until it is read by a microchip scanner. (This is not a GPS device – it does not track your pet.)

For only \$20, with no additional fees, you can greatly increase the chance that you'll see your furry family member again!

How WORKING CATS Help You


Have rodents? We have cats who need new homes that have been rescued from burned areas and construction zones where it is no longer safe to return. They can help keep those pesky vermin at bay! In fact, even the scent of a cat is enough to discourage rodents from inhabiting an area!

Our **Working Cats Program** provides up to 4 (but not less than 2) cats, depending on your situation. We set them up in large crates, which remain in place for 4 weeks while the cats get used to you and their new surroundings. And, we provide supplies and tips on how to successfully transition them to your property to do their job.

Working Cats love a good barn, but they can also take shelter in an outfitted storage shed, shop, garage, or any place that is safe, warm and quiet. We work with you to find the best spots on your property.
