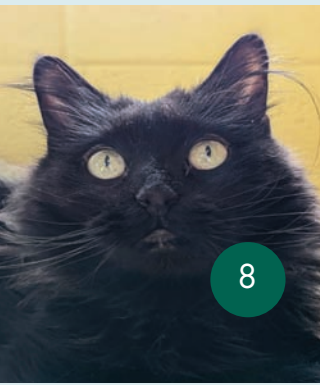

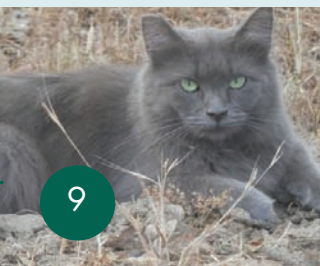

Overflowing Kennels

Friends of the Animal Shelter has worked with the Jackson County Animal Shelter (JCAS) over the past 33 years to increase the "save rate" for both dogs and cats with great success. We reached "no kill" status for dogs (90% saved), but unfortunately, that percentage is dropping.

In addition to our 200+ volunteers providing care and socialization at the Shelter, our robust Foster Program allows us to place animals that are too young to be spayed/neutered, are recovering from an illness or injury, or just need a break from the Shelter. At any given time, 20+ dogs and 150+ kittens (during kitten season) are in foster care.

We also sponsor reduced-fee adoption events to help clear the kennels. FOTAS pays the difference between what the adopter pays and what the Shelter needs to collect.

So, if the regular adoption fee for an adult dog is \$160, at a reduced-fee event the adopter pays \$50, and FOTAS pays the remaining \$110.

In 2020/2021, the pandemic led huge numbers of people to seek comfort in the company of animals. But now, shelters are swamped again. Where are all these dogs coming from? Is it "buyer's remorse"? In fact, the surrender/stray rate for dogs has stayed steadily around 10% – but 10% of more animals is a much higher number than years prior.

Jackson County Animal Shelter does not euthanize for space, but only has so many kennels and FOTAS foster homes available at any given time, so may restrict owner-surrenders. Pre-pandemic, the Shelter averaged 40 dogs; now it averages more than 80.

Friends of the Animal Shelter supports the programs of the Jackson County Animal Shelter in Phoenix, Oregon.

We provide hundreds of volunteers to help increase pet adoptions and improve the quality of life for Shelter animals while waiting for their new forever homes.

Because preventing unplanned litters is the first step to reducing pet overpopulation, all Shelter animals are spayed/neutered before adoption.

And to ensure animals get a second chance, the Jackson County Animal Shelter and Friends of the Animal Shelter fund preventative and rehabilitative medical treatments.

All of this is in service to our vision that all adoptable animals in Jackson County find a loving home. And you can help!

Owner Surrenders

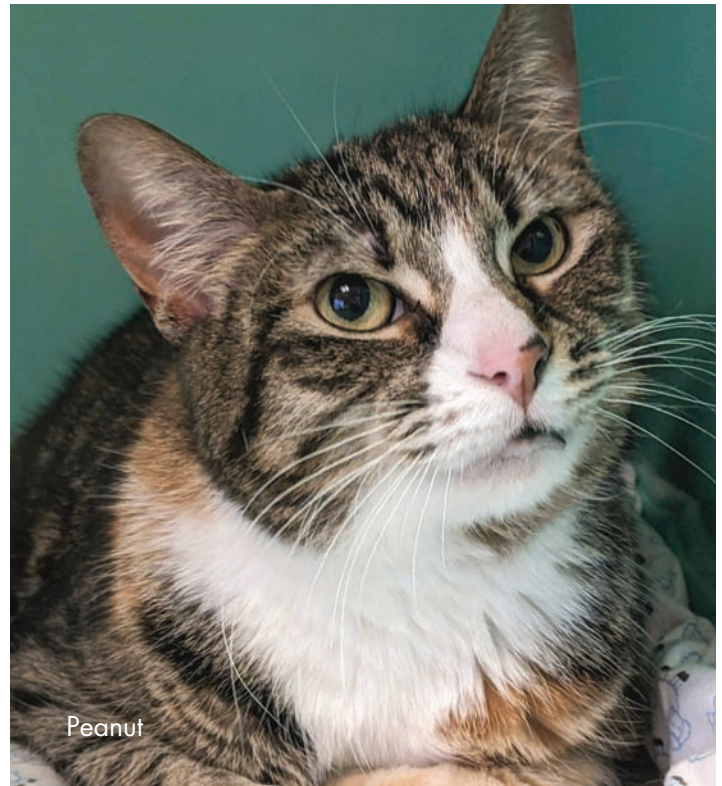
Dogs are being surrendered and rehomed in record numbers because their owners can no longer afford them, or their health, work or housing situation has changed drastically.

Rising Animal Birth Rates

To complicate things even more, during the pandemic many vets were not performing elective surgeries, so thousands of spay and neuter surgeries were postponed. Locally, appointments are still hard to come by and many veterinarians are not accepting new patients. Shelters like ours that depended on discounted surgeries from local vets are even lower on the list. That means more “accidental litters.”

Reduced Adoption Rate

Adoptions have slowed to a trickle. Rescue organizations cannot take the easy-to-place dogs, let alone the challenging ones. The presence of small dogs, purebreds, and puppies in shelters this past fall were the “canary in the coal mine.”

Fewer Veterinarians and Licensed Vet Techs

There is a drastic shortage of licensed veterinarians and vet technicians nationwide. Veterinary education is expensive and many graduate with a large debt burden. Running a veterinary practice is incredibly expensive, but many owners need discounted rates. Staff shortages are affecting them as well. Veterinarians require skilled support staff; without them, the numbers that can be served decreases.

Strays, Seizures, and Court Cases

The Shelter population includes strays, animals seized because of abuse, neglect or abandonment, those left behind after the death of their owner, surrendered pets, and animals held as evidence in court cases.

Strays must be legally held for five business days. During that time, they cannot be adopted out or transferred to other rescues. Dogs seized for legal reasons must be held until their case is settled and cannot be adopted out (those dogs are not visible to adopters, but still require staff care).

All of these factors have created rising intake numbers for shelters. Now that adoptions have dried up, it is even more challenging.

How Can You Help?

Adopt

If you're looking for a new furry family member, look for a pet that fits your family regardless of breed. And consider taking in a less adoptable animal, such as an adult dog or cat.

If you know someone looking for a pet, encourage them to consider adopting from a rescue or shelter, not a breeder.

And, please note that the adoption fees are a great deal! All animals are spayed/neutered, have a microchip, and have had some of their vaccinations. fotas.org/adopt

Adopting from the Shelter is a Good Deal!

When you adopt from the Jackson County Animal Shelter, the fee you pay is a really good deal!

- The animals are screened for behavioral issues, illness and injury. Illnesses/injuries are treated before release for adoption.
- They get some routine vaccinations for protection from distemper, rabies and upper respiratory infections. Plus, they are treated for intestinal worms and fleas.
- They are spayed/neutered and microchipped before adoption.
- And, of course, we feed and nurture our furry friends.

If you get an un-fixed "free" dog or cat, this is what to expect in "start-up fees" at your veterinarian's office:

SERVICE AT A VETERINARY OFFICE	FEE
Intake Exam	\$75
Vaccinations	\$50 - \$100
Deworming and Flea/Tick Prevention	\$50
Spay/Neuter (depending on the size of the animal, and whether it's a spay or neuter)*	\$250 - \$600
Microchip	\$25 - \$50
YOUR COST	\$450 - \$825

* SNYP offers low-cost spay/neuter for cats only, and you may need to wait months for an appointment. spayneuter.org

Compare that to the Shelter's adoption fees:	FEE
Dogs 6+ months old	\$160
Puppies	\$250
Cats 6+ months old	\$75
Kittens	\$100

Not only do you save money, but you are giving a homeless animal another chance for a better life in your loving home. And, you're making room at the Shelter, so that we can help more stray and surrendered animals find homes.

Best Buddies Wishes Come True

Jackie and Harley-Quinn, two majestic young-adult black cats, were rescued from a dreadful situation, along with two other cats, when their owners suddenly moved out of town without them.

Left to defend themselves, the four kitties were brought to the Shelter. They desperately needed some hands-on socializing, and needed to be spayed, before going into adoption. Dedicated volunteers spent countless hours loving on these kitties. Day by day, over the next three months, all four kitties blossomed into wonderful companions.

Jackie and Harley-Quinn watched as their friends went off to their new home, and wondered when it was their turn. Soon, the girls were visited by a family specifically looking for two best-buddy feline friends. They had recently lost their 13-year-old cat and they wanted a couple of kitties to fill the hole in their home and hearts. Jackie and Harley-Quinn were a purr-fect match

to the Rescue

The Working Cats Program's (WCP) mission is to relocate trapped feral cats that are considered a "nuisance," get them spayed/neutered, and find them a home where they can earn their keep.

Valerie and Ric Vilbig contacted the WCP, seeking a "natural solution" to the rodent issue on their 12-acre property in Ruch.

"Michael and Wendy Murray, volunteers who run the program, told us that the cats would not trust us, and it would take a while for them to get used to us and their new territory. We were willing to try! We agreed to provide shelter, vet care, food, and fresh water for the entire time they are our "rodent control" team."

"First, we created an ideal shelter by remodeling a shed to protect them from the elements and predators. We added some high shelves, and made it easy for the cats to settle in long-term."

"Our kitties, who we named Bright Eyes, Nettie and Betty, were trapped in a fire-damaged area in Phoenix. WCP delivered large kennels for their 30-day adjustment period, along with beds, litter and food. Volunteers did the set up, and then we let them settle in."

"Within a week, they were watching everything that moved through the screen door. They were relaxed and curious, and much more comfortable. They continued to scurry out of sight when we approached, but they were not aggressive toward us."

"A month later, when we opened the pet door, Bright Eyes was the first to emerge. He sniffed the air, ate a blade of grass, and then spent some time exploring. He caught a mouse and took it into the house to the girls. Nettie and Betty, were too timid to come out at all."

"On day two, Bright Eyes killed a young ground squirrel. Yes! On the third morning, he and Nettie played and hunted together, exploring, rolling in the dust, and watching everything. In the afternoon, we saw Nettie and Betty on the roof of their house, playing together."

"Then, we didn't see them for four days. However, I could see they were coming back at night to eat.

I needn't have worried, as they all came back, fairly exhausted, and haven't left again. They meet me at the house for breakfast, lounge around in the heat of the day, then go on patrol again in the late afternoon."

It will also enable dog owners to obtain rabies vaccinations to get a required County license for dogs over 6 months of age. Oliver Community Spay/Neuter Challenge A Huge Success



In September, Friends of the Animal Shelter received a wonderfully generous matching-fund challenge that directly addresses the #1 animal-welfare issue addressing our county – overpopulation due to “accidental” litters of puppies and kittens in Jackson County.

The Barbara Roastingear and Henry Oliver III Family Foundation pledged to match the first \$25,000 in donations to allow Friends of the Animal Shelter to establish a dedicated Community Partners Spay/Neuter Fund.

We raised more than \$75,000!

We now have formalized grant-making program that enables small animal welfare organizations in Southern Oregon to apply for funding to support spay/neuter efforts for non-shelter animals. (All animals adopted from the Jackson County Animal Shelter are spayed/neutered.)

Working with well-run community animal welfare non-profit partners that arrange for spay/neuter appointments, these small, all-volunteer organizations do not have the capacity to raise adequate funding on their own. This is another important way that Friends of the Animal Shelter is committed to ensuring animals in our community are spayed/neutered.

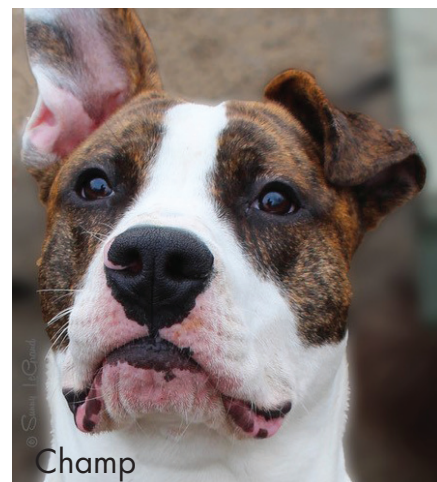
